## Part A: Curriculum music

Music provision at The Ripley Academy is as follows:

- Year 7 and year 8 music is taught the equivalent of 1 hour per week.
- Year 9 music is taught 1 hour per fortnight.
- Y10 and Y11 music is taught for 5 hours per fortnight.
- At KS4 pupils work towards GCSE in music (OCR).
- During KS3 lessons pupil have opportunities to play keyboard, ukulele and sing.
- Pupils have opportunities to compose music using rhythm grids, standard notation and music notation software.
- Pupils will also regularly listen to music and develop their appraisal skills.

#### Part B: Extra-curricular music

- The Ripley academy has a group of visiting instrument teachers who offer lessons on piano, guitar, violin, flute, clarinet, saxophone.
- We are hoping to re-start lessons on the drums and voice this academic year.
- To support the instrument lessons, The Ripley Academy has a small supply
  of violins and clarinets that we loan to pupils who are having lessons with
  one of our visiting instrument teachers. We do not currently charge for this
  service.
- During this academic year there will be an after-school choir group and a lunchtime guitar group.
- The music department is also most lunchtimes for pupils to drop in and practise or try different instruments.
- The visiting instrument teachers also give pupils details about the local Saturday music centre that they can join.

# Part C: Musical experiences

- Pupils will have regular opportunities to perform to their class during lessons.
- As part of the creative arts faculty, in the summer term Year 7 will be taking
  part in an arts event during the school day. There will be workshops in
  music, drama and art ending in a performance for parents/carers.
- Pupils will have the opportunity to perform at lunchtimes to their friends and teachers.
- There will also be a talent show where the pupils who are learning music in school and outside of school, will have the opportunity to perform to an audience in the school theatre.

## In the future

- The Year 7 creative arts drop down will become an annual event.
- The school music department will have at least a yearly showcase that parents/carers can attend.
- There will either a trip or visiting musicians arranged initially for KS4 music pupils and then extended to KS3.
