Maths Challenge Success for Year 12 and Year 13

Seven Year 12 and eight Year 13 students took part in the Senior Maths Challenge this term. The Challenge encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. The problems on the Senior Mathematical Challenge are designed to make students think. Over 250,000 students took part across the UK with the top 40% of students nationally receiving a gold, silver or bronze certificate.

We are proud to announce that 12 of our students have been awarded a certificate! Alex W was the 'Best in School' followed closely by Jake A, Gracie R, Declan D and Harry F whom all received silver certificates. Yoyo T was the awarded 'Best in Year 12' achieving a bronze certificate. Ella B, Leo P, Michael W, Nathan B, Rhys L and Andrew M were also awarded bronze certificates. A fantastic effort from everyone; well done!
